Trusts remain the preferred method of owning NFA items!

Even after the implementation of the 41F regulatory changes, there are numerous benefits to using an NFA trust to purchase NFA items instead of acquiring them as an individual.

Do you want to be able to share your NFA items with friends and family?

- The creator of a trust may name any number of joint trustees or lifetime beneficiaries.
